### 2020-2021 Registration:

August 3, 2020 - 8:00am-3:00 P.M. August 4, 2020 - 1:00pm-7:00 P.M.

(Online registration can occur any time between 6:00 A.M. on Monday, August 3– 6:00 A.M. on Wednesday, August 7.)

Never before have we faced such uncertainty heading into the summer. COVID-19 put life on hold for two months and dealt a crushing blow to our state's economy. Governor Holcomb's plan provides us with a much-needed pathway forward. Here's how we stand at the start of May.

May 20 - Last Student Day: Our last day of eLearning is scheduled for Wednesday, May 20. iPad/Chromebook return and student item pickup is in the works for that week.

<u>May 22 – Last Food Distribution:</u> We will send out meals on the buses one last time, after which the buses will be parked for their summer vacation.

<u>June 21 – Graduation:</u> If the state successfully mitigates the spread of COVID-19, groups of up to 250 people will be permitted to assemble with appropriate social distancing. With a senior class of less than 55 students, we believe it would be possible to conduct some type of ceremony with the blessing of the Department of Education.

<u>July 4 and Beyond:</u> If all goes according to plan, we should be able to operate at some level of openness during the month of July. This *may* include athletics practices, Kindergarten Roundup, pool usage, summer school, marching band practice, and other activities involving students which are currently prohibited.

<u>August 3 & 4 – Registration:</u> We hope to have online and in-person registration to prepare for the school year from 8:00-3:00 on August 3 and 1:00-7:00 on August 4.


<u>August 12 – First Student Day:</u> Our hope is to be starting school with all of our students back in the building in a way that is safe and conducive to learning. We would also have the capacity to toggle back to distance-learning should the need arise.

All these plans are all tentative and subject to change. We appreciate the prayers and support of the community as we've adapted, and we look forward to continuing to meet the needs of students in 2020-2021.

**Hep B** The minimum age for the 3rd dose of Hepatitis B is 24 weeks of age.

**DTaP** Four doses of DTaP/DTP/DT are acceptable if 4th dose was administered on or after child's fourth birthday.

**Polio** Three doses of polio vaccine are acceptable for all grade levels if the 3rd dose was administered on or after child's fourth birthday and at lease 6 months after the previous dose with only one type of vaccine used (all IPV or all OPV).

For students in grades kindergarten through 5th grade the final dose must be administered on or after the 4th birthday, and be administered **at least 6 months** after the previous dose.

Varicella Physician documentation of disease history, including month and year, is proof of immunity for children entering preschool, kindergarten through 7th grade. Parental report of disease history is acceptable for grades 8□12.

**MCV4** Individuals who receive dose 1 on or after their 16th birthday only need 1 dose of MCV4.

**Hep A** The minimum interval between 1st and 2nd dose of Hepatitis A is 6 calendar months. K-3rd grade is required. \*For grades 4-11, two doses of Hep A are recommended. For 12th grade, 2 doses are required.







### Medical/Religious Exemption

### Dear Parent/Guardian:

Your child has a medical/religious exemption to vaccination and is not fully immunized. Although your child remains at risk for getting a vaccine preventable disease, IC 20-34-4 permits your child to attend school.

In the event of an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease for which your child is not fully vaccinated, your child may be excluded from school to protect his/her health and the health of all our students and staff. It is important to understand that with some diseases such as measles, one infected child is an outbreak. The length of time your child will be kept out of school depends on the disease. Your child's exclusion may be as long as 3-4 weeks.

If your child is excluded from school, your child will also be excluded from school sponsored activities, such as sporting events, dances, and graduation that occur within the exclusion period. The school will notify you when your child can return to school.

Incompletely vaccinated children can be excluded from school due to cases of measles, chickenpox, pertussis, mumps, or any other vaccine preventable disease (at the discretion of the local health officer).

### **Acknowledgement of Consequences of Incomplete Vaccination**

I understand that my child may be excluded from school in the event of an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease.

I understand that school exclusion includes after-school activities, such as sporting events, dances, and graduation.

I understand that my child may be required to stay home for multiple weeks during an outbreak of a vaccine preventable disease for which he/she is not vaccinated.

### **EXEMPTION FOR IMMUNIZATIONS**

The Indiana State Department of Health will allow objections to immunizations to be raised on the following grounds:

Medical- A physicians' certification that a particular immunization is or may be detrimental to the child's health is required. This must be in writing from the physician (M.D., D.O., or Nurse Practitioner), signed by the parents and renewed on a yearly basis.

Religious- A written statement that the objection to immunizations is based on religious grounds is required. This must be signed by the parents and renewed on a yearly basis.

### Driver's Education 2020

AGE: 15 years old by June 1, 2020

<u>REQUIREMENTS:</u> Driver's Education in Indiana exists in two parts. There is a Classroom portion and a Driving portion. The State of Indiana requires that you complete 30 hours of classroom time or an equivalent online program. You will take your Classroom portion of Driver's Ed online through **Driving Brilliance.com**. You are also required to take 6 hours of in the car training to complete Driver's Ed. At West Central driving will be done during the month of June. You must be at least 15 years old in the State of Indiana to get your Learner's Permit. If you complete Driver's Education and hold your permit for 180 days, then you will be able to get your license when you are 16 years and 90 days old.

<u>CLASS:</u> The classroom portion of the class will be done online through Driving Brilliance. To access the registration go to **drivingbrilliance.com** and select register, Drive at my high school. **Make sure to put West Central as the high school**. Students may begin the online class after they turn 15, and must be completed to drive this summer. The online class may be done at home, on school computers during the school year, or students may also come to school to use computers during the first two weeks of June.

<u>FEES</u>; Total cost for the program will be \$275.00. A \$25 fee will be paid to Driving Brilliance for the online class. The fee must be paid online. A \$250.00 fee will be paid to West Central for driving. Out of corporation students will be charged \$350. Students not completing the class will be refunded \$150.00 (only if requested in writing).

<u>PERMIT</u>; Students will be given a CDE form once they turn 15 years old and have the \$250 fee paid. This form is what is needed to get the student driving permit. Students will take the CDE form and proper documents (found in Driver's Manual) to the license branch to get their permit. Students must take and pass a written test at the license branch over the driver's manual to get their permit. The manual can be found online at <a href="www.in.gov/bmv/">www.in.gov/bmv/</a> under the drivers education tab. I have also ordered manuals to be delivered to West Central.

<u>DRIVING</u>: Each student must drive for 6 hours. Driving groups will be assigned at the end of May. Driving will begin at West Central and students will be dropped off at West Central after driving.

<u>VACATIONS:</u> If there is a specific week a student cannot drive, please fill out the form below so we do not schedule the student to drive during that time. Remember there is only so much flexibility we will have to get all students scheduled. Please include any camps, 4-H fairs, and vacations.


